# **Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)**

Schools can receive additional funding for pupils whose parents are in receipt of certain income- related benefits. For any pupil entitled to Pupil Premium, the additional funding means that we are able to provide extra support in many ways.

# **Attendance and Punctuality**

# We have a statutory duty to provide you with this information each term

If you consider that there are exceptional circumstances relating to your request, please let the school have full details. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis.

# **Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School**

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school (absence without the agreement of the school or not covered by a medical note) and will be used by Surrey County Council in the following circumstances:-

- **1.** Pupils identified by police and Inclusion Officers (formerly Education Welfare Officers) engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.
- **2.** Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more).

Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 01 September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

# The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.


In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body must decide whether there are exceptional circumstances. They may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not authorised. Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

**3**. Finally, the issuing of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance. This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration. If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is

#### Important Reminders...

#### PE Kit Expectations

Your child should wear full school uniform at all times unless it is their allocated PE day, in which case they should arrive in school dressed in their PE clothes and trainers. Please can I remind parents that children are not allowed to wear any jewellery.



#### **Packed Lunches**

Please do not send your child to school with any nuts or products containing nuts such as peanut butter or Nutella as we have children in school who suffer from potentially life threatening anaphylaxis if they come into contact with nuts. When providing a lunch box from home please also ensure that it does not include sweets, chocolate bars, sweets or flavoured drinks.



# Absence reporting

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please phone the school office **before** the start of the school day. There is an option to leave a message and report your child as absent. Please include your child's name, class and details of illness.

If your child has had diarrhoea or vomiting they must stay off school for 48 hours since the last bout of diarrhoea or vomiting.

extremely important that you act without delay to secure their regular attendance. If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement in your child's attendance, please contact your child's school or the Inclusion Officer.

# **Penalty Notice relating to Exclusions**

If a child is excluded from school, Section 103 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 places a duty on parents/carers to ensure that their child is not in a public place without justifiable cause during school hours.

This duty applies to the *first five days of each exclusion*. Failure to do so will render the parent/carer liable to a Penalty Notice. (Alternative education provision will be made available from the sixth day of any exclusion.)
